Ensuring the Future of Chamber Music San Francisco

Our supporters have helped build Chamber Music San Francisco, with our three-city design, into a robust organization which will be sustainable in the future. After all, San Francisco, Walnut Creek and Palo Alto are thriving population hubs, and the central idea – the world’s top musicians performing in three concerts in three cities in three days, expenses shared with all parties benefitting – will endure.

How to plan for that future? Director Daniel Levenstein designed the structure and currently manages it. In order to ensure a healthy future, the Board of Trustees has initiated a succession strategy which includes commitments of legacy gifts, most often made through bequests in wills, to build an endowment that will eventually fund 15% of the operating budget.

Currently 60% of our \$500,000 annual budget derives from donations, principally from our individual supporters. The balance is secured through private foundations and institutional giving.

The Board of Trustees is launching the Levenstein Legacy Circle, and is encouraging current and future gifts to ensure the long-term sustainability of Chamber Music San Francisco. Daniel Levenstein has personally committed to a minimum bequest of \$300,000 to the fund.

We are deeply grateful to our supporters for their help, and we hope that they share our satisfaction in the remarkable results we have created together.
